Neighbor to Neighbor

Of the 27 families who were living in the Franklin Manor Mobile Home Park at the time of the announced closure, 24 of those families have sought help through the collaborative assessments coordinated by the Centre County Office of Adult Services. With only a few weeks until the deadline to leave (October 1) there are still a few families seeking a place to live that is within their means. Solutions for those remaining are still being sought. Many thanks to those who have already helped (individuals and congregations) over the past few weeks. As a result of your kindness some of the displaced families are now enjoying their new homes.

Interfaith Human Services has, since the beginning of the Displaced Residents Fund program in November of 2012, assisted 117 people (81 adults and 36 children) secure permanent housing solutions. To date, the amount distributed is \$56,280. Thank you for caring.

WISHING WELL - LET THE BELL-RINGING BEGIN!

It's time to check your calendar and think about that yearly tradition of ringing bells which helps raise funds to support the emergency financial assistance efforts at IHS. Your one hour generates more than contributions: it creates a community awareness of the needs of our neighbors.



In 2013-14 Interfaith Human Services assisted 61 adults and 35 children with emergency financial assistance money that was generated through the Wishing Well Campaign. This money stopped families from losing their utilities, from being evicted and paid for unexpected prescriptions due to sudden illness or hospitalization.

2014 CROP WALK SET FOR OCTOBER 19

The 31st State College CROP Walk will be held on Sunday, October 19, at St. Paul's United Methodist Church, located in downtown State College on the corner of College Avenue and McAllister Street. Registration begins at 1:30 PM with the walk commencing at 2:00 PM. The 5K route winds through the borough, ending back at St. Paul's. There is no fee to join the walk.

In 1984 a group of local people joined together to organize the first-ever State College CROP Hunger Walk. Consisting of members of a number of local congregations, the walk planners set out to join the fight against hunger and poverty.



That first year the CROP Walk raised \$10,000. The most recent CROP Walk, held in October 2013, raised more than \$31,000. Since that first CROP Walk in State College the total amount raised has been \$457,000!

Remarkably, the highest CROP Walk totals raised here have been between 2007 and 2013, in tough economic times. Organizers believe this makes a statement about our community and its willingness to help those in need.

75% of the funds contributed to the walk go to Church World Service or any of a number of other relief agencies that a donor may designate; 25% of funds raised go to the local food bank.
