Dear friends.

Following is an update of the status of the Displaced Residents Fund and the families it has served.

As of November 12, 23 of the 24 families from Franklin Manor Mobile Home Park have found housing, 1 family still seeks a solution.

Of the Franklin Manor families who sought help:

- all remained in Centre County
- some families combined to solve the need
- about 50% stayed in State College

Since December 2012, when the first request was made to the Displaced Residents Fund:

- 130 people have been assisted (88 adults and 42 children)
- a total of \$71,787 was received in contributions
- 52 people from Franklin Manor were assisted (39 adults and 13 children)
- \$24,570 was distributed to Franklin Manor residents

No administrative fees were collected by IHS to provide this community service.
