2016 INTERFAITH HUMAN SERVICES WISHING WELL CAMPAIGN

It's time to check your calendar and think about that yearly tradition of ringing bells which helps raise funds to support the emergency financial assistance efforts at IHS. The Wishing Well Campaign is a major fundraiser for IHS and they hope to raise \$30,000 this year. The money is used to help families avoid losing their utilities, from being evicted from their homes, and for paying unexpected prescriptions due to sudden illness or hospitalization. You may have noticed some newer copies of the "green book," the Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW), in our pews. They have a gold label on the front and a book plate mounted on the inside cover. These have come to us from Bethany Lutheran Church in Cranston, RI, where Karl Raynar attended church with his grandparents. This congregation began its ministry in 1892, but recent demographic changes along with congregational decline caused the congregation to close in 2015. Thus, the congregation no longer had need for their LBWs.

Karl learned about the availability of the hymnals and made arrangements for them to be brought here to Trinity. He along with Bette Larson, Keith and Diane Smith, Esther Lauchle, Jean Quinn and Jean Ross processed the newer hymnals and replaced some of the more used LBWs in the pews.

WILL YOU HELP?



On Sunday, November 13, we will begin our HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE AND TOYS FOR TOTS DRIVE for 2016. Trinity has played a

significant part in the success of both of these drives and we hope we can count on your continued support this year. We are asking members

of Trinity to bring a nonperishable food item each Sunday from November 13 to December 15. Trinity collected over 800 food items last year, which was great, and we hope we can match or beat that number this year. We will also have a Toys for Tots box at the church if you want to donate a toy for the drive. It was the Food Drive of Trinity nine years ago that helped get this Holiday Food Drive going in Centre County. The food pantries of Centre County have be-



come dependent on this drive to help them get through the holidays and the first couple months of the new year.

We could also use your help with the Toys for Tots wrapping sessions. On Thursday, December 15, we will be meeting at the Penn Stater at 5:30 pm to begin setting up for the wrapping sessions. We will need help getting the toys into the Penn Stater, setting up the wrapping rooms and even doing a little wrapping. Because of the later date in getting into the Penn Stater, we need to have a large number of our gifts wrapped by Friday so they can be given out by the State College Food Bank on Saturday. As a result, we are doing things a little differently this year to get things done on time. We could also use anyone who is available to help us on Tuesday, December 20, at 6:00 pm to move the remaining food and toys to trucks to get them to our Unregistered Site at Hills Plaza. Having enough volunteers to do a bucket brigade down the hall, across the corridor, and down two flights of stairs, makes it much easier to get the trucks loaded. With approximately 75 volunteers, we are able to fill 6-7 box trucks in just over 90 minutes. Because finals will be over by this time, we can't count on help from the Penn State students this year.
