Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In a recent sermon I began by observing that we all want to fit in, we long to be accepted, we need to be affirmed. While this may be true for all of us at times, fitting and belonging in are not the same. When we seek to fit in we often present ourselves the way we think others want us to be, whereas belonging or being accepted means we are welcomed just as we are!

One might think that in this day and age, with so many ways to stay connected with others that most people would feel like they belong and are frequently affirmed, but studies indicate that not to be the case. In fact, the more people connect with others in digital ways the lonelier they feel! Perhaps it's the aspect of "virtual reality" that comes with digital technology. Social media on line conveys a level of community but also allows for people to post and critique others in ways that are hurtful. We may get a lot of "likes" on our social media page, but that only feeds the desire for more and more affirmation—real life affirmations not virtual ones.

Sherry Turkle, a psychologist, has been studying the impact of digital technology on people for the past 15 years. I recently came across a TED talk where she shares some of her discoveries and some suggestions on what we as a society might consider doing. It's a bit long but well worth watching!

After hearing her talk, I found myself thinking that we as the church are in a perfect position to contribute to the conversation, but more so, we are in a perfect position to offer true community, which, I think, most people desire.

Clearly, technology is not going away so how might we utilize social media to help build true community? How might we help our younger disciples to seek and participate in true community along with that or digital or social media? How might we invite others to become part of our faith community?

I'm beginning to understand some of the questions, but I think Ms. Turkle has correctly identified that we need to have conversations about all of this. If nothing else, the conversation itself might lead to greater community for those who participate!

LENT BEGINS

Seems like we just got through Christmas and now Lent begins? Both are true, of course! Lent begins somewhat early in 2015 because Easter comes early this year! Easter is set using these criteria: the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. I have no idea who came up with that one!

Anyway, Lent is a time where disciples focus on renewal or ways to strengthen one's faith and faith practice in preparation to celebrate the wonderful news of Jesus' resurrection! To that end, once again there will be devotional booklets available on the table across from Fellowship Hall. Feel free to use and share them with others for the 40 days of Lent.

Like many other congregations, we will have special gatherings. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18. Worship will be offered at 12:00 pm with a 30-minute service and a fuller service at 7:00 pm. Ashes will be administered at both services.

Throughout Lent, we will gather on Wednesday nights at 7:00 pm to share in Holden Evening Prayer. Given how busy most all of us are, the hope is that Wednesday nights during Lent will be a time for us to gather in community to quiet our hearts and minds as we focus upon God's love and grace.

This year, plans are being formed to hold a Passover Seder meal. This is the meal Jesus was celebrating with His disciples when He instituted the Lord's Supper. At present, the meal is set for Wednesday of Holy Week, April 1 (no fooling!) with our traditional Maundy Thursday worship on April 2.

Watch for additional details on these and other plans for Lent as we make our way to the Cross of Christ and then to the Empty Tomb at Easter!
