Candidacy is the process of discernment and preparation leading individuals to approval for public ministries of the ELCA and

participation as leaders in the work God in this Church. The staff of the Allegheny Synod administers the candidacy process through the ELCA. Persons who sense a call to the ministry of Word and Service or the ministry of Word and Sacrament enter the candidacy process through our Synod's Office of the Bishop. A committee of dedicated lay and rostered leaders meet with and follow candidates through the process until they are assigned and able to receive a call.

May 2015 Authorization of Lay Worship Leaders

+ For over 25 years, DYD has been providing the opportunity for adults in the synod to further their religious education. Through this program, some have discerned a call to public ministry and seminary and are now pastors serving in our Synod.

+ DYD provides training for our lay worship leaders, although the classes are open to anyone.

+ Our Allegheny Synod currently has more than 40 authorized lay worship leaders who have received training through DYD.

+ On any given Sunday, an average of 15 lay worship leaders are serving congregations in our Allegheny Synod where a called pastor is not available to lead worship.

Because of your Mission Support, our Synod can continue to equip leaders through the DYD program and, through these leaders, enrich the worship and learning lives of congregations like yours. Thank you for your continued support of our Allegheny Synod through prayer, participation, and financial gifts.
