Friends,

The Churches of the Rebersburg Charge have spent the last year undertaking the journey of becoming a Samaritan Safe Church, where all children who are in our church or come into our church are safe from abuse. We've studied the effects of abuse, especially sexual abuse, on people, the patterns of grooming and abuse, we've analyzed our facilities and our policies to see where they could be tightened to better protect children, and we've crafted a policy for our churches that will affect how we work with children, how we care for children and under what circumstances we can welcome some offenders into our community without endangering our children.

Part of this process is providing a retreat for adult survivors of abuse. While this retreat does seek to address some of the healing and spiritual needs of survivors, it does not proselytize or include traditional religious traditions; we understand that many people may have been hurt by the church or people of faith and may be less trusting.

The format of the retreat, like the entire Samaritan Safe Church process, was developed by the Samaritan Counseling Center in Lancaster, PA, and a qualified therapist will be present during it.

The retreat will be held on Saturday, November 14, starting at 9 AM, at the Madisonburg Civic Center, Madisonburg, PA. There is no fee for this retreat, but we do encourage preregistration. If we do not receive at least four registrations by November 10, we will cancel the retreat – four participants are needed to ensure proper confidentiality and boundaries in the retreat itself.
