
### SMALL GROUP STUDY

Judy Kennedy, a case manager from Interfaith Human Services' Financial Care Program, worked one-on-one with Megan every week to help her with her personal finances.

Together, they paid every bill until Megan was able to do it on her own.

Judy was Megan's strongest advocate.
