Parking Lot Resurfacing and Line Painting



From the Pastor's Desk

October 19/20, 2024

Dear Beloved of God,

"It sucks to be you!" These words have been spoken to me many times by our one daughter, particularly when I'm not feeling well or for some other reason, life is not running smoothly. The past five days, that statement has been both true and accurate. I finally contracted COVID, not too badly but the test was positive. The two lines on the test strip showed up almost before I put the treated drops in place! As of this writing, however, I'm in the clear, or so I understand. My how good it feels to be healthy again!

Still, as with most people, dealing with an ailment or illness causes us to reflect and ponder our situation. Many passages of scripture come to mind, but this morning these observation from Paul came to mind:

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³ And not only that, but we also boast in our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. ⁶ For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.

Perhaps a bit overdramatic, since COVID was not as bad as the suffering Paul endured, still, any sort of pain or discomfort cause us to rely more heavily on God for healing and restoration. "Fearfully and wonderfully am I made," writes the Psalmist. (139:14) Our bodies are amazing!

Along with giving thanks to God the Great Physician, I am grateful for:

- All of you who have and continue to keep me in your prayers
- The phone calls of concern and compassion
- The healing that our bodies can do when we rest and recuperate
- The many donations of candy for our Halloween Table out by North Oak
- The leadership of our Council and Staff
- All of you who are the Body of Christ, the Church know as Trinity Lutheran—this is an amazing congregation filled with faithful, obedient followers of Christ

Throughout my days of COVID I again experienced Paul's reminder that hope does not disappoint us, even if COVID is no longer the life-and-death threat it once was. I am deeply grateful for recovering and renewed energy to engage in ministry.

I am also deeply grateful for our partnership in this ministry to which God has called us and gathers us by the Holy Spirit. To God be all glory and honor now and forever!
