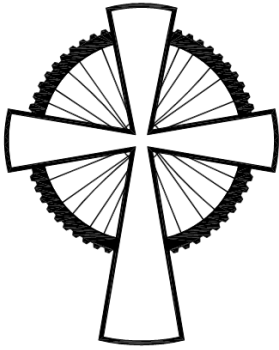

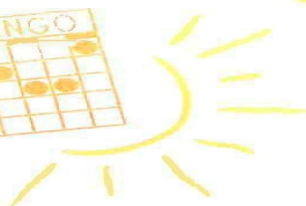

VISITATION TRAINING

Like to visit people? Thinking of embarking on a visitation ministry? Want to improve your listening skills?

Allegheny Lutheran Social Ministries (ALSM) is providing a visitation training program in **September and October** for congregation members who may be feeling called to visitation ministry.

We plan to address common concerns like: What will I talk about? What if they have difficulty hearing? How long should I stay? What happens if they have difficulty speaking?

Educational sessions will be held at 10:00 am on 9/2 and 10/7 at The Oaks (instructors will join those who are gathered through Microsoft Teams online).

Follow-up reflection sessions will be held at 10:00 am on 9/23 and 10/28 online via Microsoft Teams.

Those participating will receive names of residents on The Oaks' campus to visit between the training and reflecting sessions.

The visitation schedule is flexible. All participants who complete the training will receive a certificate of completion.

HELP TO SUPPORT the much-needed programs if Interfaith Human Services.

Did you know...?

Interfaith Human Services (IHS) was formed church leaders who recognized the need for a central organization where they could refer individuals who routinely came to them for financial assistance. IHS programs aid individuals and families to achieve financial stability. Programs include:

- ◆ **The Financial Care Program** assists individuals who are deemed unable to manage their money due to mental health or intellectual disabilities. Case managers handle clients' funds to ensure their basic needs are met and bills are paid on time.
- ◆ **The Emergency Vehicle Repair Program** helps to keep our working low-income neighbors on the job. Assistance through this program means that an unexpected car repair cost doesn't mean losing their job.
- ◆ **The Centre County Fuel Bank Program** works to help individuals and families to avoid heating emergencies. The program operates from January 1–March 31, assisting with heating oil, wood, propane, coal, and wood, to eligible residents.
- ◆ **The Free Furniture and Appliance Recycling Program** provides gently used household furniture, beds, and large electrical appliances at no cost to eligible individuals and families in Centre County. Offsetting the cost of furnishings and large appliances helps households stretch their income to cover other necessities.

Volunteers and staff at IHS also assist people to find other programs and services that help to meet their needs. Help is only a phone call away!
